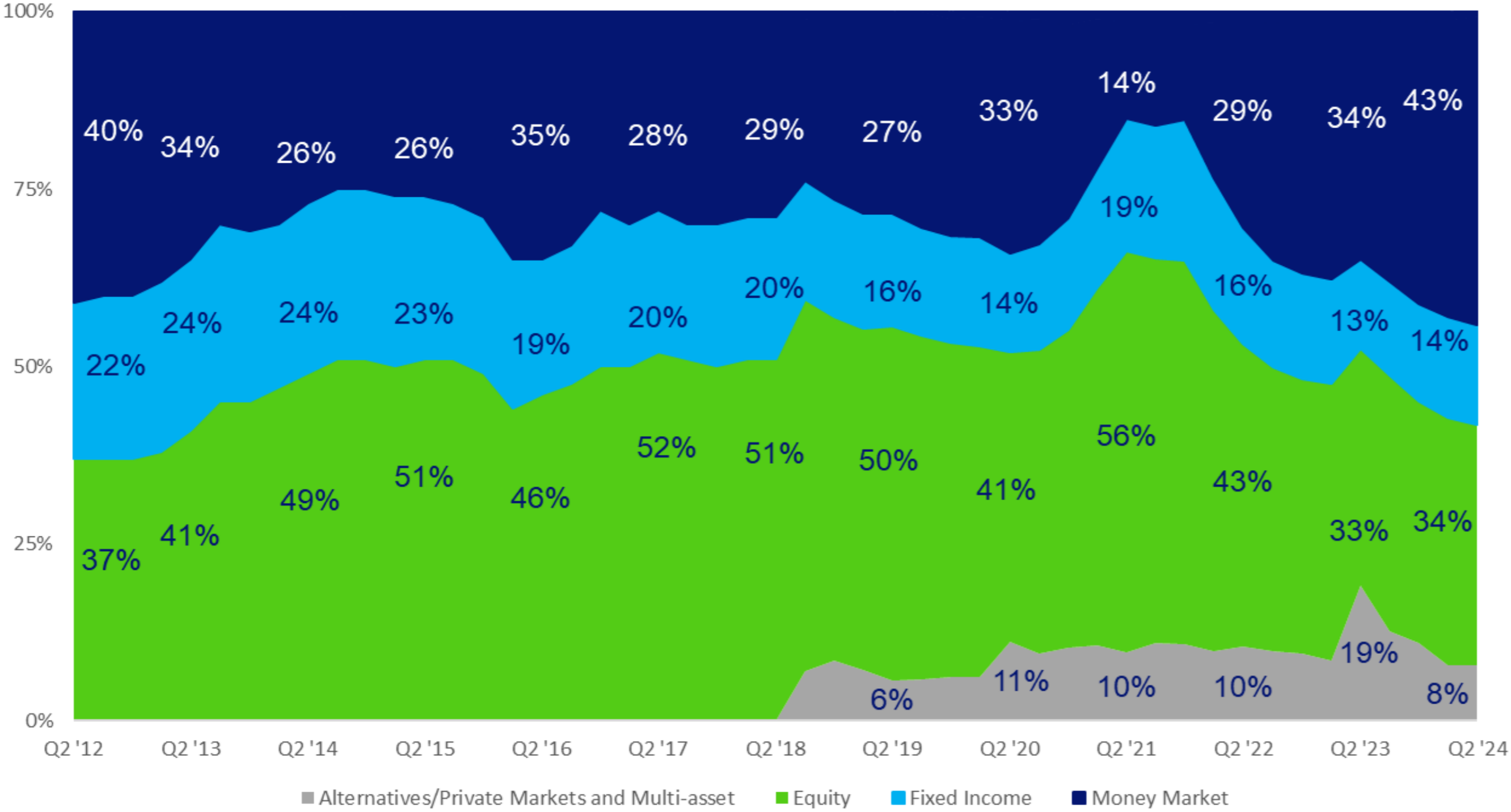

Percentage of revenue less distribution expense by asset type*



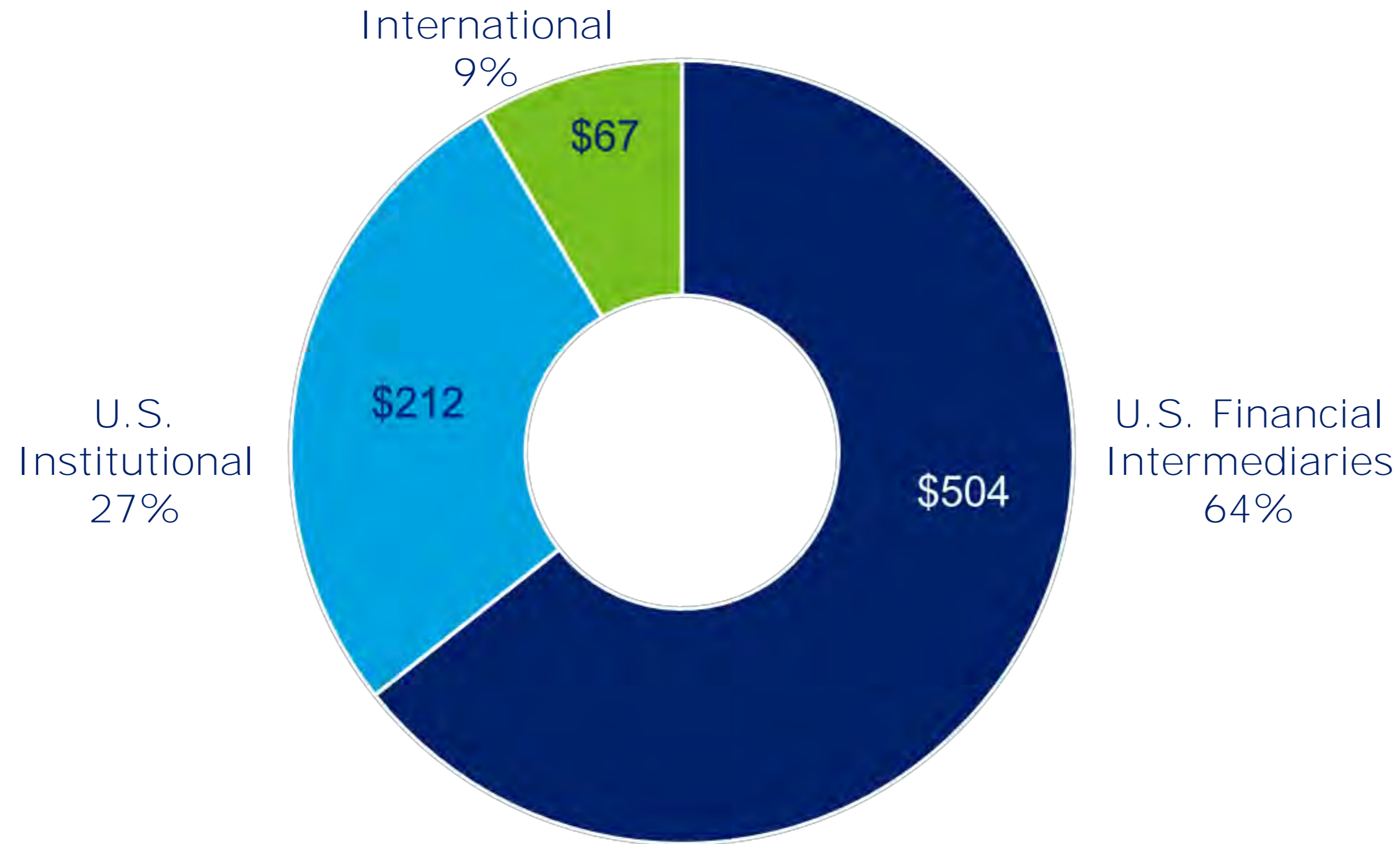

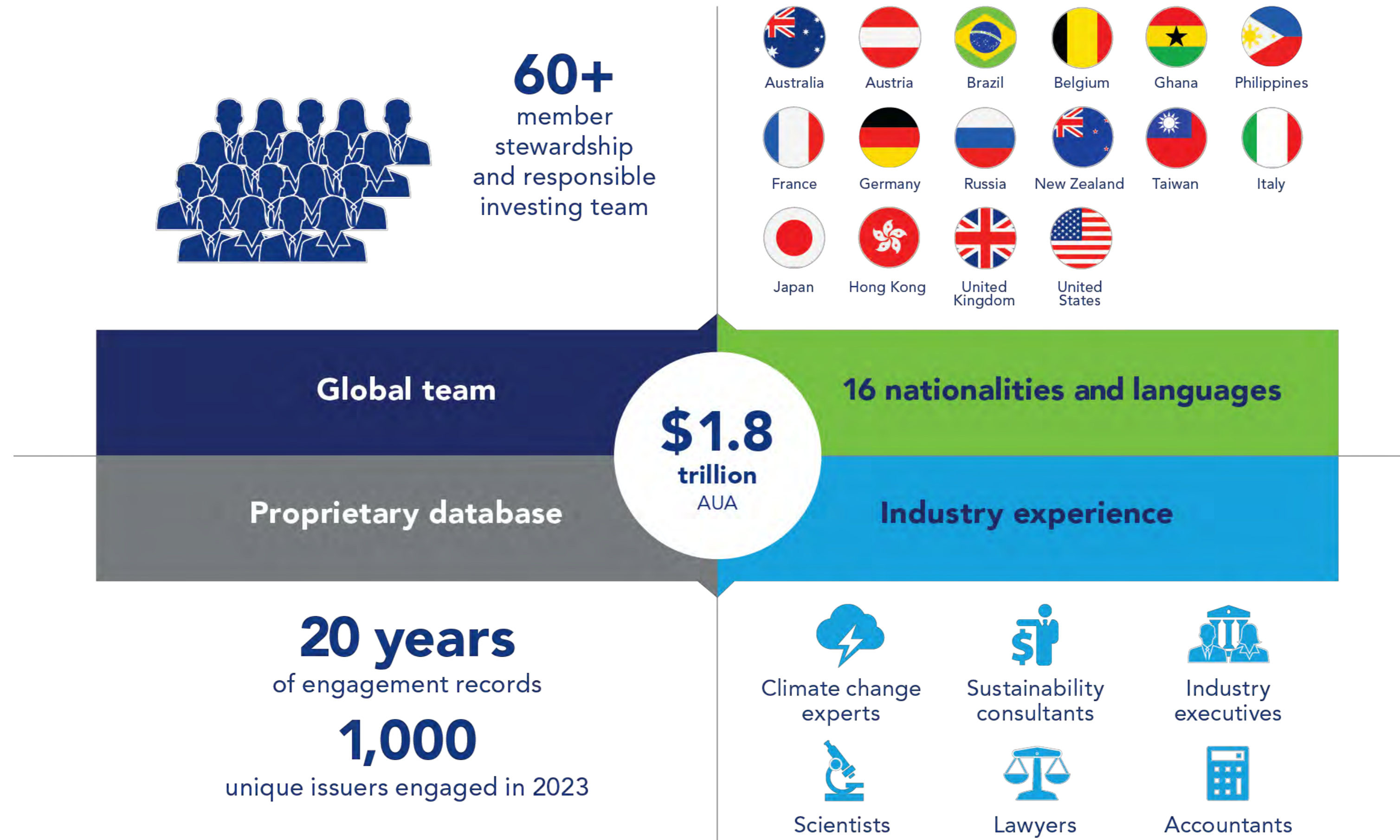

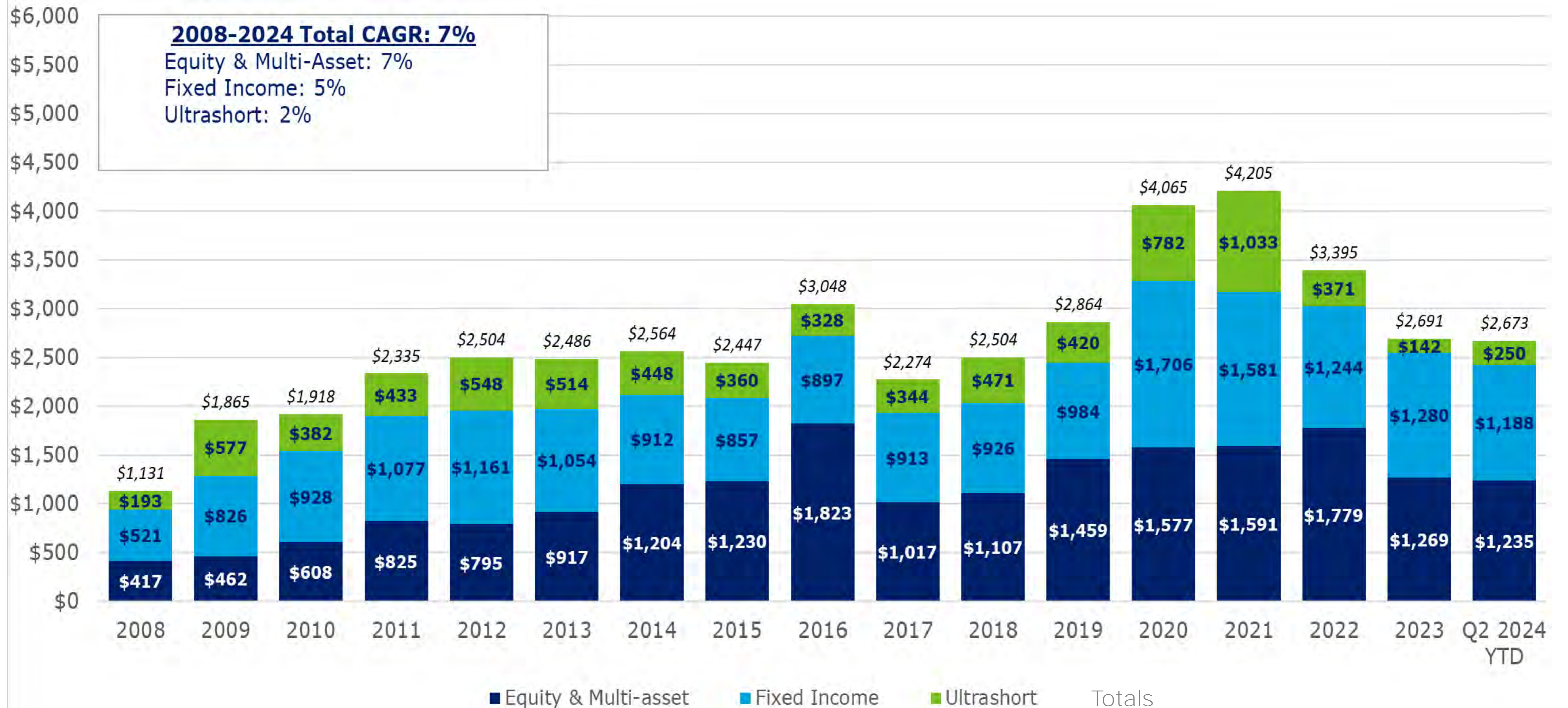
EOS at Federated Hermes

Equity and multi-asset, fixed income and ultrashort (\$ in millions)

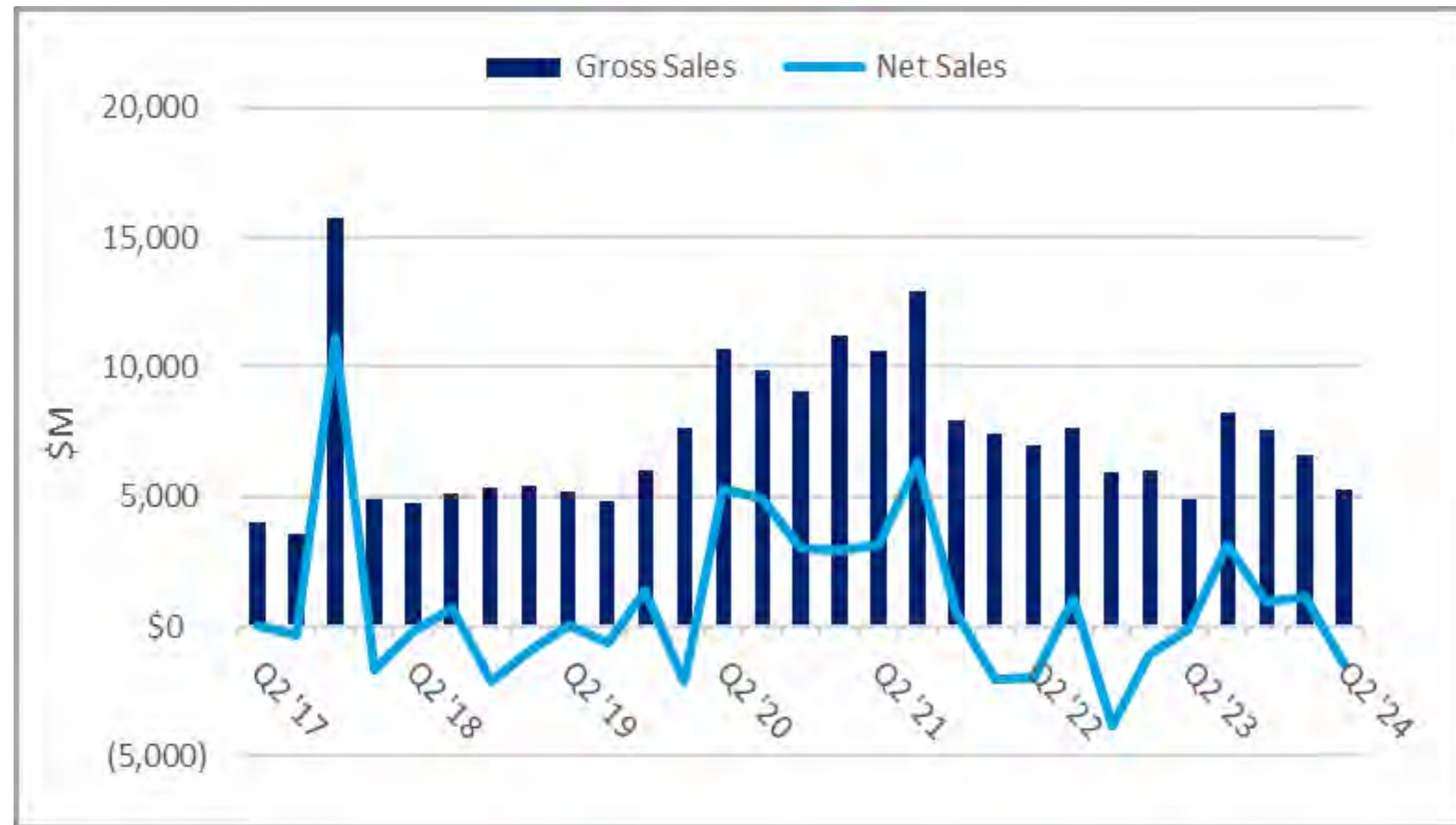

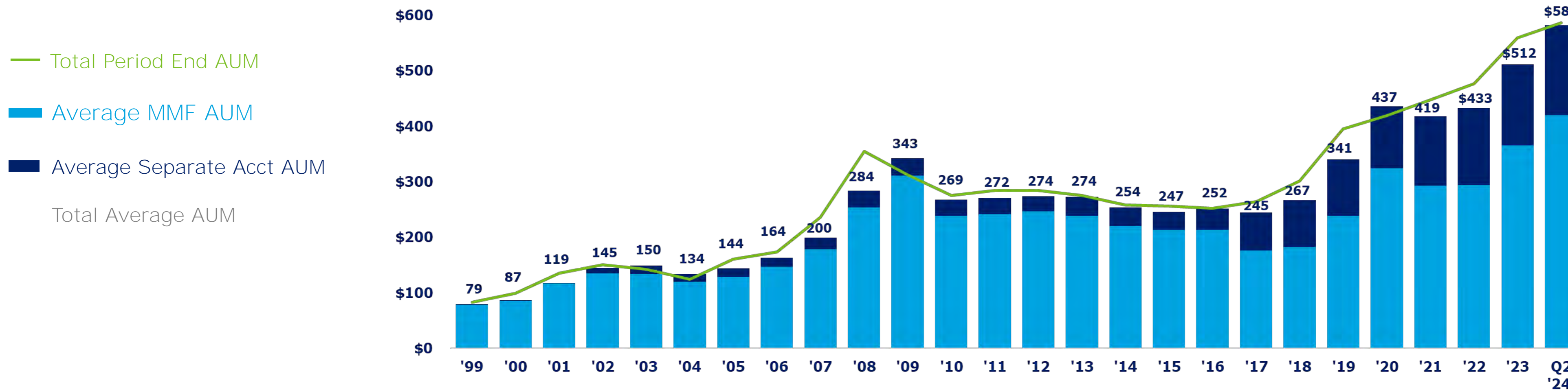

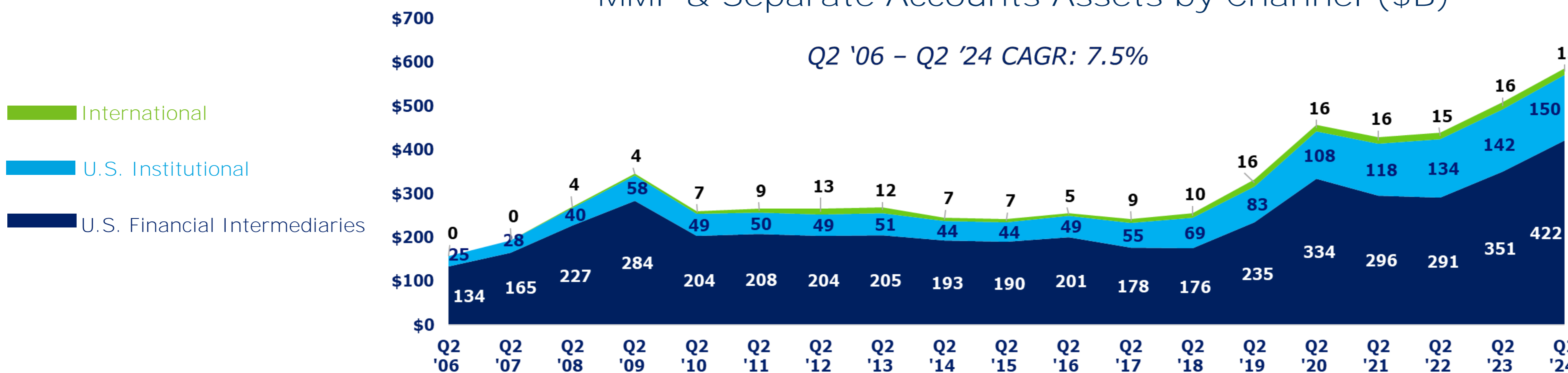

MMF & Separate Accounts Assets by Channel (\$B)

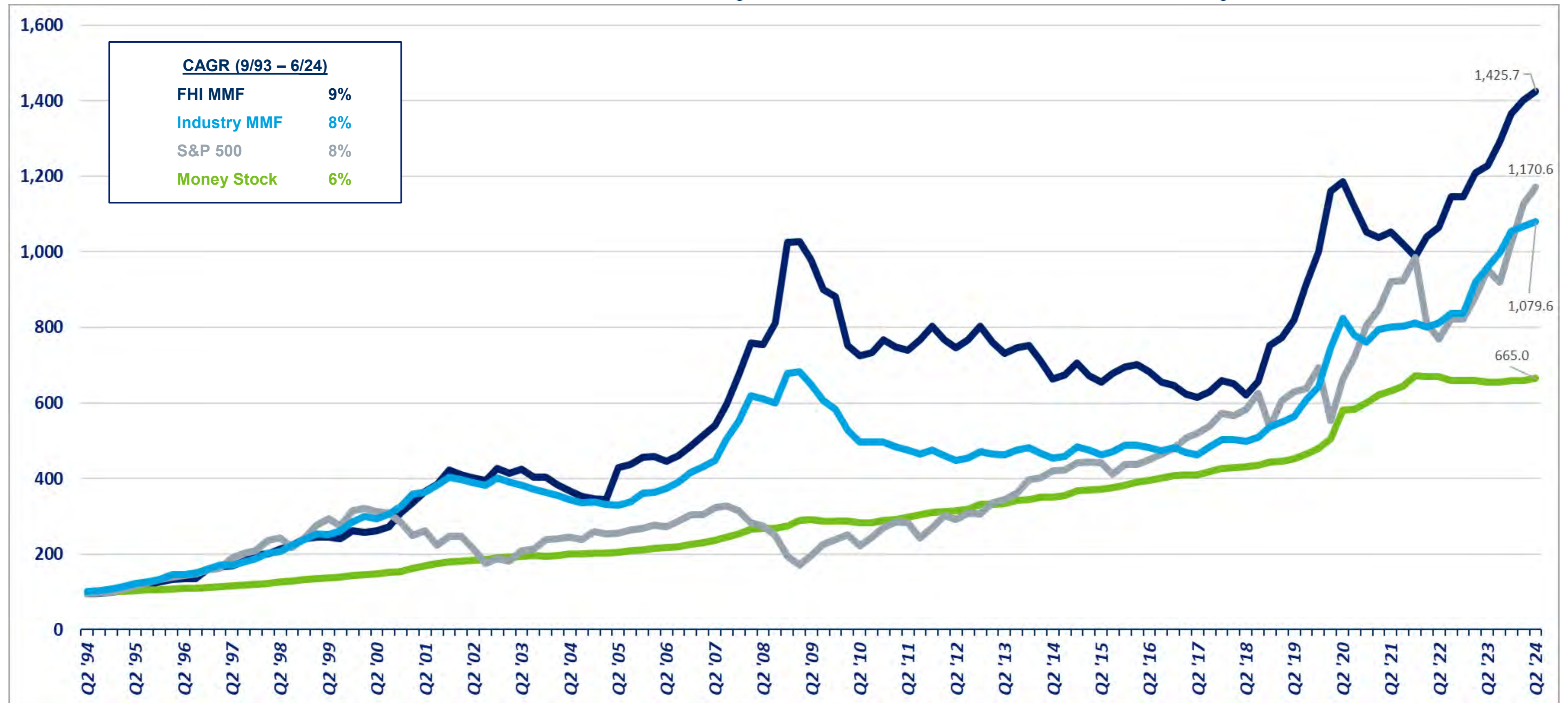

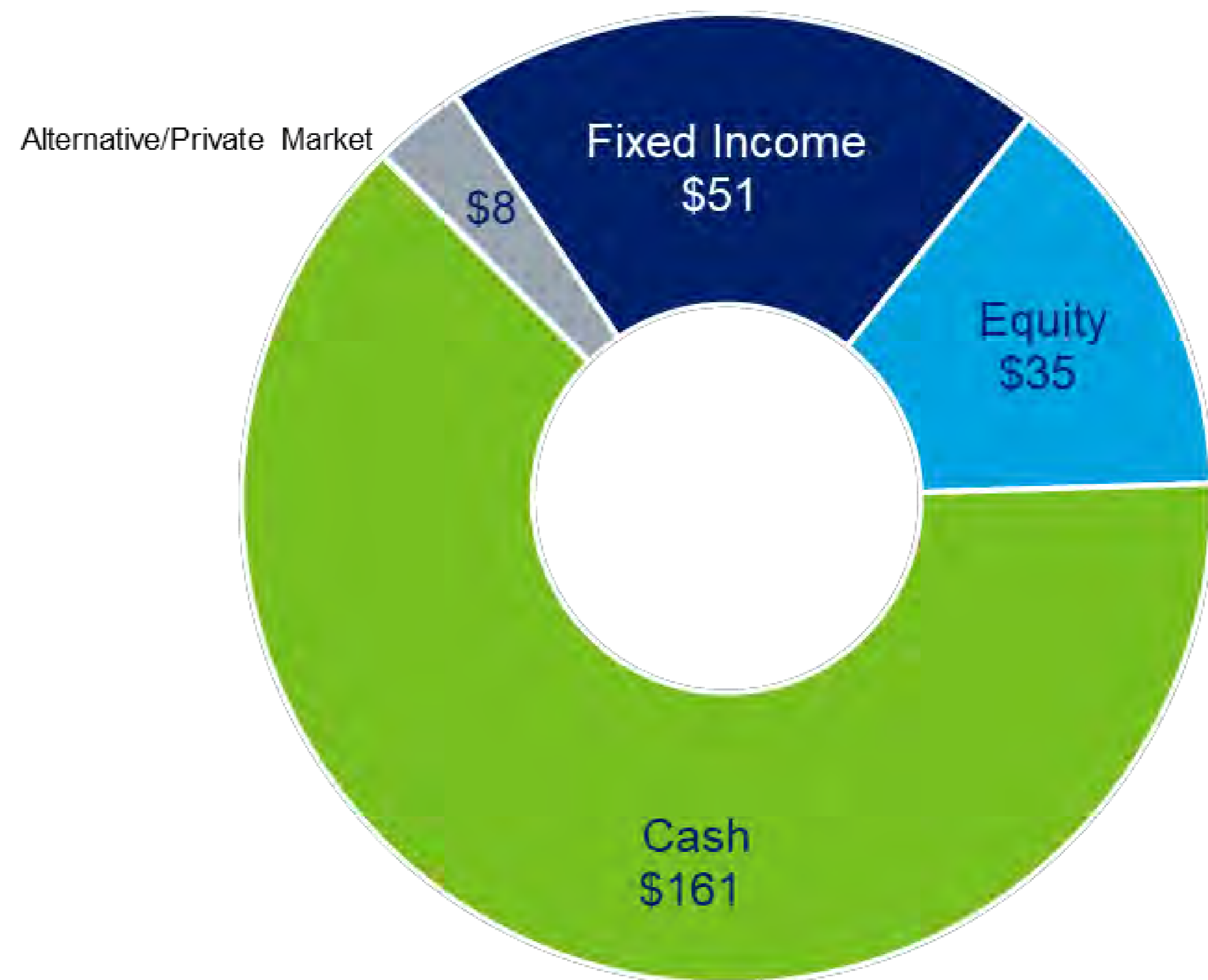

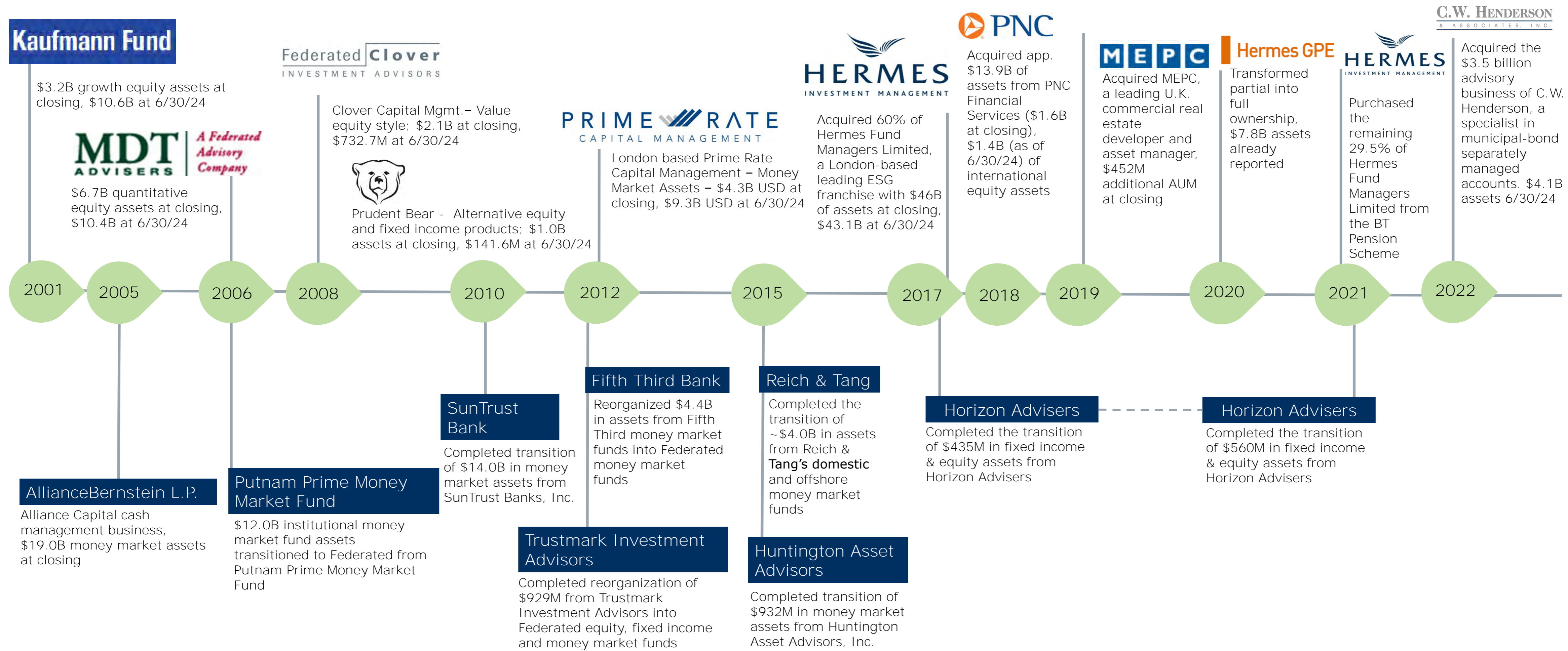

Assets by region (\$ in billions)

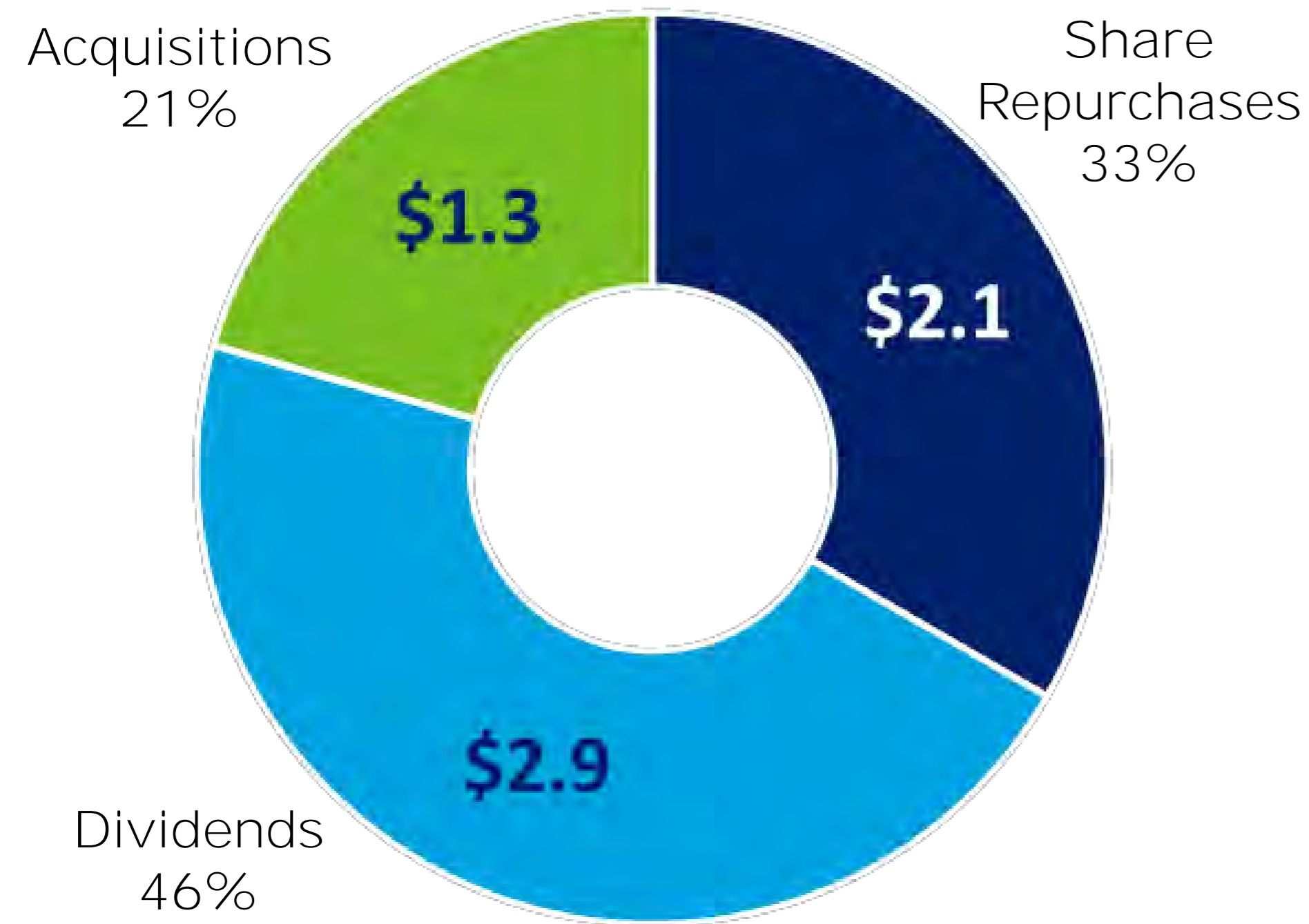

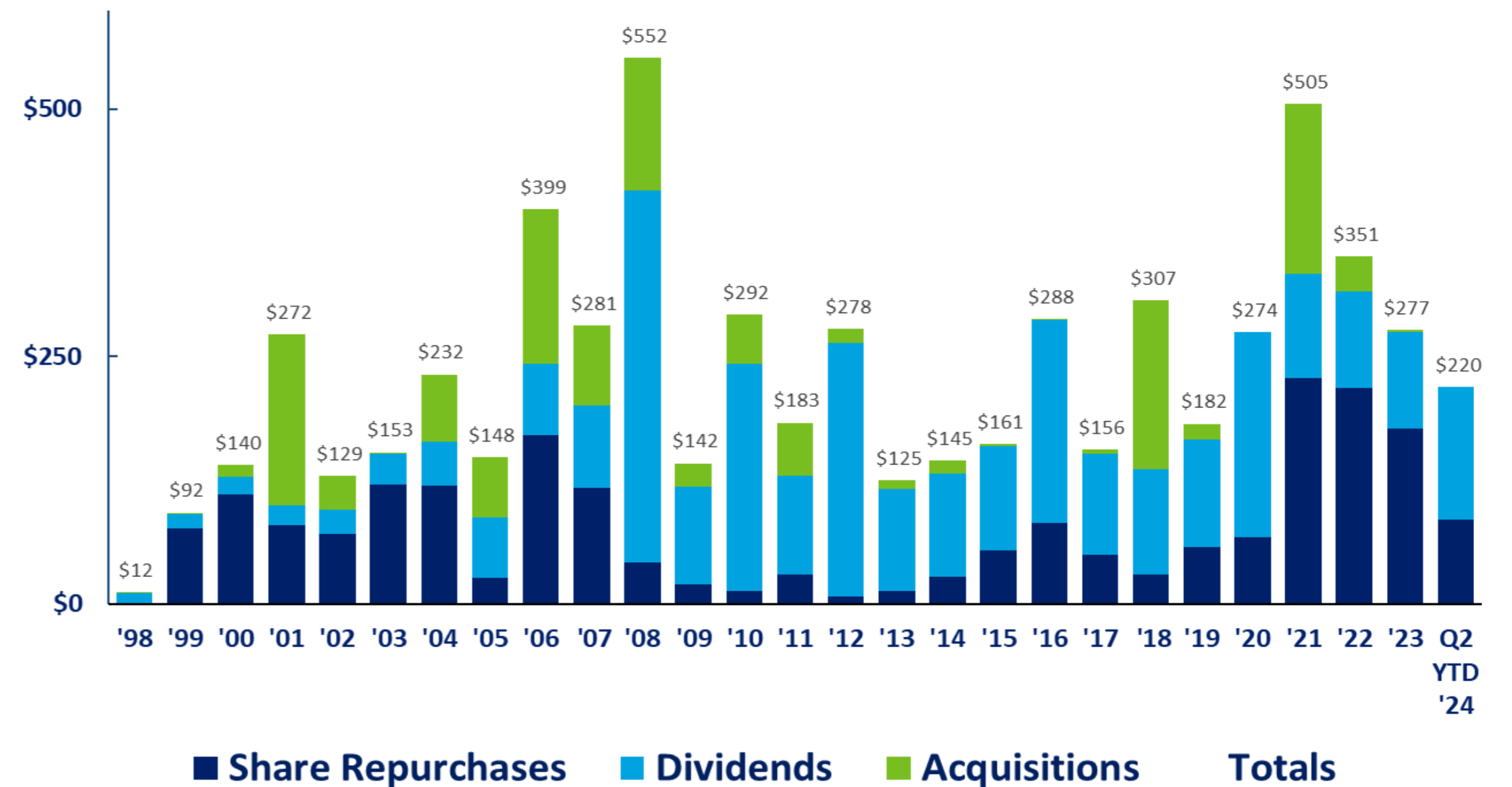
Historical uses of cash (\$ in billions)

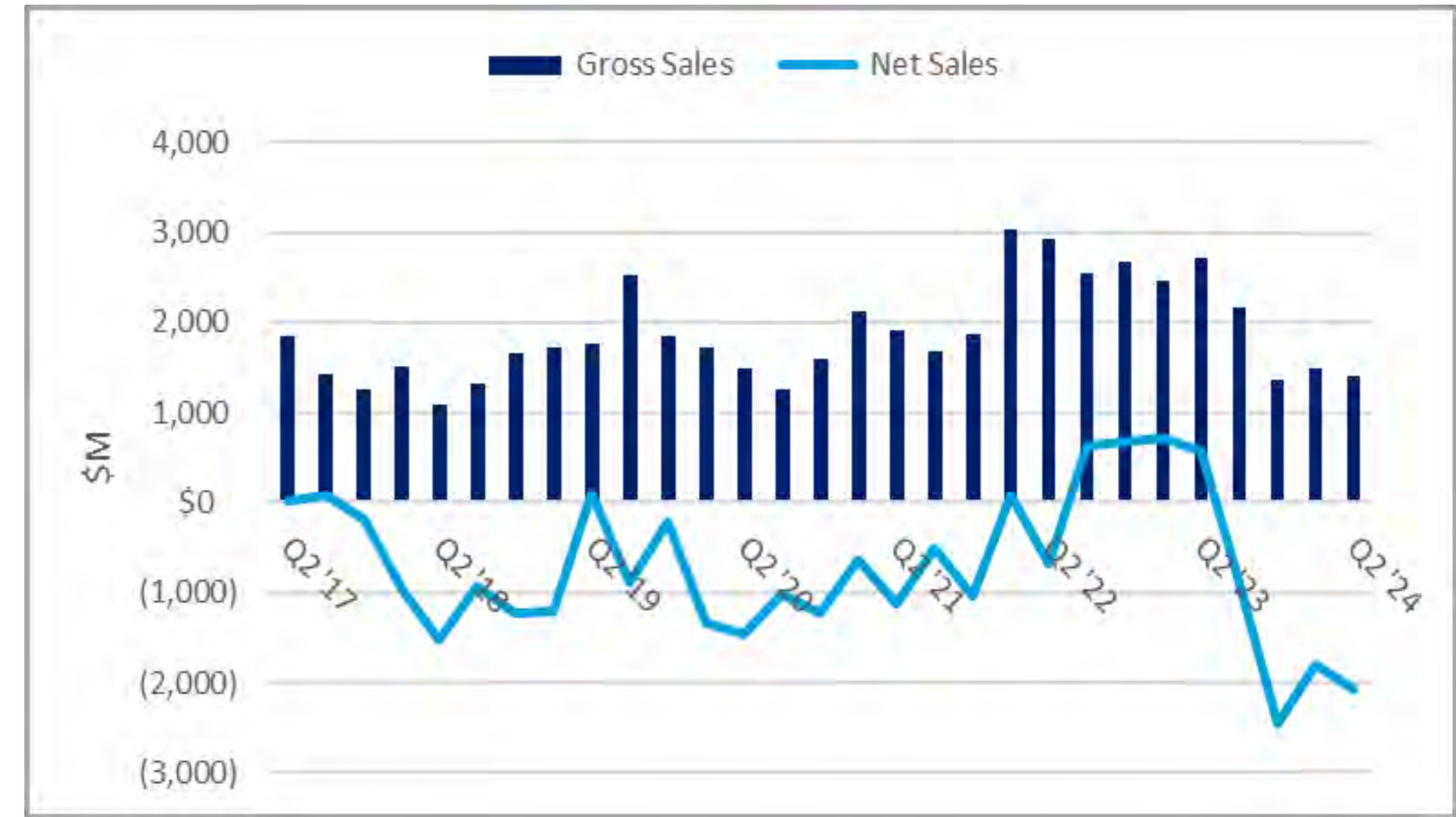
