Dividend changes prior to sale in the TTM*: On 6/12/25, Target Corp. increased its dividend by 1.8%. On 7/1/25, Bank of New York Mellon Corp. increased its dividend by 12.8% and JPMorgan Chase & Co. increased its dividend by 7.1%. On 7/30/25, Clorox Co. increased its dividend by 1.6% and Kenvue Inc. increased its dividend by 1.2%. On 9/18/25, Texas Instruments, Inc. increased its dividend by 4.4%. On 10/22/25, American Electric Power Co., Inc. increased its dividend by 2.2%. On 12/9/25, Realty Income Corporation increased its dividend by 2.8%. On 2/17/26, Genuine Parts Co. increased its dividend by 3.2%. On 4/14/26, Johnson & Johnson increased its dividend by 3.1%.

Realty Income paid an additional monthly dividend to catch up prior missed distributions in 2025. Dividend income will appear lower in 2026 as they return to their normal distribution pattern.

30-day yield (also known as "SEC yield") is a compounded and annualized figure calculated according to a formula set by the SEC. The formula requires use of a specific methodology for calculating dividends and interest earned, and expenses accrued, during the period. The standardized computation is designed to facilitate yield comparisons among different funds. In the absence of temporary expense waivers or reimbursements, the 30-day yield would have been 2.89% at net asset value.

Weighted average dividend yield is the prospective dividend yield for each security averaged based on the percentages of the securities in the portfolio. Prospective dividend yield is calculated by taking the most recent declared dividend payment multiplied by the number of dividend payments typically made during the year for each holding divided by the current share price for each security. This is calculated based on a snapshot in time and may change due to fluctuations in share prices, dividends actually paid and changes in holdings in the portfolio.

Beta measures a portfolio's volatility relative to the market. A beta greater than 1.00 suggests the portfolio has historically been more volatile than the market as measured by the fund's benchmark. A beta less than 1.00 suggests the portfolio has historically had less volatility relative to the market.

The ratings provided are sourced from securities ratings agencies S&P Global Ratings (S&P), Scope, and Moody's. S&P and Scope, and (Moody's), respectively, make the following credit rating classifications: A (A) or better are considered to be high credit quality; credit ratings of BBB (Baa) are good credit quality and the lowest category of investment grade; credit ratings BB (Ba) and below are lower-rated securities ("junk bonds"); and credit ratings of CCC (Caa) or below have high default risk. A modifier of 1 or + indicates that the obligation ranks in the higher end of its rating category and a modifier of 3 or - indicates a ranking in the lower end of the category. NR indicates that a rating has not been assigned or is no longer assigned.

The Bloomberg Issuer Default Risk model generates the probability of default over the next year. The model categorizes stocks based on three categories: Investment Grade, High Yield, and Distressed. The highest rating (lowest probability of default) for an Investment Grade stock is IG1, the lowest rating is IG10.

Fund shares are bought and sold on an exchange at market price (not NAV) and are not individually redeemed from the fund. However, shares may be redeemed at NAV directly by certain authorized broker-dealers (Authorized Participants) in very large creation/redemption units. Brokerage commissions will reduce returns.
